"To the elders among you, I appeal... Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, watching over them *—not because you must, but because* you are willing... not pursuing dishonest gain, but eager to serve; not lording it over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock. And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory..." 1 Peter 5:1-4

In His infinite wisdom, God has a plan for the men and women that He is calling into His service. It is not a call without a motive or purpose. When the Lord calls, it is because He has a specific plan.

What is the purpose for which God calls the church elders?

Let us analyze the above text, and in it we will find a clear definition of what that purpose is.

I. SHEPHERD THE FLOCK OF GOD

"To the elders among you, I appeal... <u>Be shepherds</u> of God's flock that is <u>under your care</u>." 1 Peter 5:1-2

- Must be concerned for the physical and **spiritual** health of the church.
- Must be concerned about **<u>feeding</u>** the sheep well.
- Will not allow the sheep to be spiritually **malnourished**.
- Will avert the sheep from going to <u>other pastures</u> to feed.

- Will be watchful that the families of the church conduct <u>family</u> <u>worship</u>.
- Will assess the <u>spiritual life</u> of the church.
- Will not deliver mediocre sermons to which not enough <u>time</u> has been spent in preparing for them.
- Will put in place programs that will enrich the <u>spiritual</u> life of the church.

Bible counsel illustrates:

"And David shepherded them with integrity of heart; with skillful hands he led them." Psalm 78:72

"Then I will give you shepherds after my own heart, who will lead you with knowledge and understanding." Jeremiah 3:15

"Keep watch over yourselves" and all the flock of which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers. Be shepherds of the church of God, which he bought with his own blood." Acts 20:28



The flock is to be pastured with:

- 1. INTEGRITY Psalm 78:72
- 2. EXPERTISE (competence) Psalm 78:72
- 3. SCIENCE (knowledge) Jeremiah 3:15
- 4. INTELLIGENCE (wisdom) Jeremiah 3:15

II. LOOK AFTER THE FLOCK OF GOD

"To the elders among you, I appeal... Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care." 1 Peter 5:1-2

- Will safeguard the church from false <u>doctrines</u>.
- Will safeguard the church against ineffectiveness in <u>soul-</u><u>winning</u>.
- Will make sure the church does not focus on trifling matters and forgets what is **important**.
- Will make sure the church is faithful in returning <u>tithes</u> and offerings.

- Will safeguard the church from turning <u>extremist</u> in certain areas and very liberal in others.
- Will make sure that all things in the church are done according to the Law and the **Testimony**.
- Will make sure the spirit of <u>competition</u> does not take over the leadership.
- Will be watchful of their own <u>testimony</u>, the testimony of their family, and the testimony of the church.

- Will safeguard the church from the influence of wicked persons who come with new <u>doctrines</u> based on their own views.
- Will ensure that in the church all the glory and honor always goes to <u>God</u>.
- Will ensure that the pulpit is always regarded as <u>sacred</u>.
- Will safeguard the **music** that is presented in church.
- Will look after the **youth** and children in the church.

"Therefore this is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says to the shepherds who tend my people: Because you have scattered my flock and driven them away and have not bestowed care on them, I will bestow punishment on you for the evil you have done,' declares the Lord." Jeremiah 23:2

III. PERSUADE AND NOT FORCE

"Watch over that flock because you want to, not because you are forced..." 1 Peter 5:2, ERV

- Force achieves <u>temporary</u> results.
- Persuasion achieves <u>lasting</u> results.
- Force causes <u>rejection</u>.
- Persuasion brings <u>acceptance</u>.
- Force <u>foists</u>.
- Persuasion <u>convinces</u>.

- Obedience by force is based on <u>fear</u>.
- Obedience by persuasion is based on <u>love</u>.
- Force <u>destroys</u> teamwork.
- Persuasion <u>cements</u> teamwork.
- Force is part of the tools of the **<u>enemy</u>**.
- Persuasion is part of <u>God</u>'s method.

"So I said, Wisdom is better than strength. But the poor man's wisdom is despised, and his words are no longer heeded." Ecclesiastes 9:16

IV. WORK VOLUNTARILY

"...because you want to, not because you are forced to do it." 1 Peter 5:2, ERV

- Is always ready to <u>visit</u> the flock.
- Volunteers to organize <u>missionary</u> work.
- Is willing to take the <u>time</u> that the church requires.
- Is willing to invest time in **training** other leaders.
- Is willing to work with the **youth**.

- Is always ready to **preach**.
- Is always available to <u>attend</u> board meetings.
- Promotes and <u>supports</u> the various clubs that exist in the church.
- Is interested in maintaining a <u>baptismal</u> class.
- Works well to retain the newly **<u>baptized</u>**.

"Now the overseer is to be above reproach, faithful to his wife, temperate, *self-controlled*, respectable, hospitable, able to teach." 1 Timothy 3:2

V. BE AN EXAMPLE OF HONESTY IN EVERYTHING

"...not pursuing dishonest gain." 1 Peter 5:2

- Are honest in their <u>dealings</u> with other people.
- Are honest in their <u>work</u> for God.
- Are honest in returning to God <u>tithes</u> and giving <u>offerings</u>.
- Are honest in their daily <u>tasks</u>.

• Are honest with their **families**.

- Are honest in their business transactions.
- Are honest with the <u>time</u> that belongs to God.
- Are honest in dealing with the **opposite sex**.

- Are honest with <u>God and</u> <u>other men and women</u>.
- Are honest with their **spouses**.
- Are honest with their **<u>children</u>**.
- Are honest with the **organization**.
- Are honest in all <u>aspects of</u> <u>life</u>.

"...not given to drunkenness, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, not a lover of money. He must also have a good reputation with outsiders, so that he will not fall into disgrace and into the devil's trap." 1 Timothy 3:3,7

VI. SPREAD ENERGY TO PEOPLE

"...not pursuing dishonest gain, <u>but eager to serve</u>;" 1 Peter 5:2

- Are hardly ever <u>discouraged</u>.
- Are great <u>motivators</u> for the church.
- Always find <u>solutions</u> to conflicts.
- Give <u>advice</u> that is always appropriate and expected.

- Are filled with positivity and <u>optimism</u>.
- Are consummate optimists, but with their <u>feet on the</u> <u>ground</u>.
- Almost always look at things from the <u>bright</u> <u>side</u>.
- Are **promoters** of big ideas.

- Are men and women others can always <u>count on</u>.
- Put all things in <u>God's</u> <u>hands</u>.
- Know how to **face adversity**.
- Emphasize the **positive aspects** in everyone.
- Will not succumb to be destruction during <u>hard</u> <u>times</u>.

"Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing... And we urge you, brothers and sisters, warn those who are idle and disruptive, encourage the disheartened, help the weak, be patient with everyone." 1 Thessalonians 5:11,14

VII. SHOULD NOT CONSIDER THEMSELVES AS THE MASTERS OF THE CHURCH

> "...not lording it over those entrusted to you." 1 Peter 5:3

- Understand that the only star of the church is <u>Jesus Christ</u>.
- Understand that <u>they are not</u> <u>in charge</u>.
- Work in harmony with the **pastor**.
- Take into account the <u>other</u> <u>leaders</u>.
- Listen to suggestions made by <u>members</u> of the church.

- Aim to achieve <u>consensus</u>.
- Do not seek glory for <u>themselves</u>.
- Take into account the **youth** of the church.
- Show interest in <u>new</u> <u>members</u>.

- Do not act as if they are the owners of the church, and demolish walls, make renovations and do remodeling, or hang up pictures or add ornaments, without having any <u>regard for the other</u> <u>leaders</u> or the church board.
- Delegate **responsibilities**.

"Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others. In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature God,

did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; rather, he made himself. nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death—even death on a cross!" Philippians 2:3-8

VIII. ARE AN EXAMPLE TO THE FLOCK

"...but being examples to the flock." 1 Peter 5:3

- Example in <u>consecration</u>.
- Example in **missionary work**.
- Example in <u>faithfulness</u> to God.
- Example in <u>humility</u>.
- Example in <u>dedicated service</u> to the church.

- Example in <u>treating</u> others well.
- Example of <u>concern</u> for souls.
- Example of absolute <u>dependence</u> upon God.
- Example of good parent and <u>spouse</u>.

"Command and teach these things. Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith and in purity. Until I come, devote yourself to the public reading of Scripture, to preaching and to teaching. Do not neglect your gift,

which was given you through prophecy when the body of elders laid their hands on you. Be diligent in these matters; give yourself wholly to them, so that everyone may see your progress. Watch your life and doctrine closely. Persevere in them, because if you do, you will save both yourself and your hearers." 1 Timothy 4:11-16

IX. ARE INTERESTED IN AND LABOR FOR THE SALVATION OF SOULS

"And when the chief shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that will never fade away." 1 Peter 5:4

- Labor first and foremost in the <u>salvation</u> of souls.
- Their goal is <u>eternal life</u>.
- Yearn for the salvation of their **families**.
- Yearn for the salvation of the <u>church</u>.

- Yearn for those <u>around</u> them to be saved.
- Yearn for the **youth** of the church to be saved.
- Strive for the salvation of the <u>children</u>.

- Make <u>plans for salvation</u> by organizing programs that contribute to the salvation of the church.
- Personal salvation, the salvation of their families, and the salvation of the church are the supreme goals of their lives.

X. BECOME A FRIEND OF JESUS

- Friends are <u>sought for advice</u>.
- Friends are <u>asked for help</u>.
- Friends are <u>kept in mind</u>.
- Friends help when making big <u>decisions</u>.

- Friends are *imitated*.
- Friends of Jesus are <u>friends of</u> the other leaders of the church.
- By beholding the life of his friend Jesus, Jesus <u>transforms</u> them into His own likeness.
- By spending much time with Christ, they <u>will be like</u> Jesus.

"Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command." John 15:13-14
